As 2020 is drawing to a close, many of you would agree that it has been a crazy year both here in Israel and worldwide.

Despite the challenges we have seen, the Lord at work in our midst and look forward to what He has for us all in 2021. Thank you for standing with us.

Your prayers and support are a vital part of our ministry.

This past year at Netivah we have had to rethink how we do ministry and how we can effectively reach out to the young people around us despite the many restrictions. Currently the youth in Israel are studying remotely at home via ZOOM, with very limited time in school or social activities. Any opportunity they have for fellowship and recreation is precious and cherished. To accommodate this situation many of our programs had to be revised and adjusted several times to meet the varying limitations. Nevertheless, we have seen the hand of God at work and rejoice in the unique opportunities we have had to reach out to the youth, soldiers and youth leaders and are excited to share this with you.

# → What happened lately?

October 15 – "Arrows" (Chetzim)
Program Graduation. We streamed the graduation live with no additional guests attending other than the staff and participants. However, it was wonderful to hear the testimony of a few of the graduates of what Yeshua had done in their lives over the past two and a half months. Of the 19 graduates seven of them are already in the military and the others are waiting for their draft date. We continue to keep in contact with them.



This Fall we placed two big tents outside of the office and ran walkways from the office to the tents in order to enable us to gather a smaller number of people outdoors (to match the restrictions of 20 people permitted to meet outside at one time). A bonus to this is that the Netivah center sits on the Israeli National Trail and many hikers stop in for the night, using the tents and the outside facility. It is such a joy to talk and share with them and give them a place to rest, a decent shower and shelter for the night.

### November

Because of the COVID-19 restriction, we had to postpone the Soldiers Conference scheduled for November, but instead of dropping it all we planned two weekends where 20 soldiers were invited for a meal, fellowship, worship and a devotional. It was a blessing for the soldiers who have been out of fellowship for so long. It went so

well that we plan to do this again as soon as the restrictions for gatherings are lifted.

### December

Youth leaders regional gathering – Again, due to the restrictions, we were unable to have our annual youth leaders conference, so we decided to meet the youth leaders in regional small groups (up to 20). Our first meeting was at Beit Eliyahu Congregation in Haifa. AND IT WAS SOOOOO GOOD! We are scheduled to have our next meeting (Lord willing)

in Jerusalem during January or February as we are under strict travel and gathering limitations for the next few weeks.





### Youth

We began to do **one day youth gatherings** with 20 youth at a time using the outdoor tents. We enjoyed a meal together, with teaching, time of worship and fellowship. Our first meeting was with teens in the 11th grade since they are at a critical stage due to the first military screenings. We talked about a how to be a true servant in God's eyes and also went over the process they will be going through in their first military checkup. The next gathering will follow as soon as the restrictions are lifted.

Junior Leadership Training – We continued our program for 11th and 12th grade
Junior Staff. Our first meeting was in October where we still were able to have
gatherings in capsules of 20, but unfortunately, we have had to postpone our next training weekend as
restrictions got tighter and the numbers became more limited.



<u>Media</u> – We continue to put out the 'Mamash Po" ("Right here") Videos, at the first of every month, in order to provide the youth and leaders with quality materials for learning about the Biblical sites and bring to life the Word of God. We had an opportunity during this time to work on our Netivah Website providing teens, soldiers, youth leaders and parents with relevant materials. We have also launched our own **Netivah App** on AppStore and Google Play in order to make all of our teachings, videos, and materials readily available.



### **Youth Leaders**

We are feeling that many youth leaders need to be personally encouraged and supported in their challenging work especially during these difficult days. In order to reach out to them Joel has committed one day a week to meet with different youth leaders from around the country face to face (with masks) for coffee or a meal. This is a great opportunity for him to hear their struggles and testimonies first hand together with encouraging and praying with them.

We are happy to let you know that **Randy Sigulim** is back working on the Netivah team in a leadership role after spending the last two and a half years in the US serving with a local congregation in Sacramento. Randy and his wife Miri have two small boys Yishai and Asaph.

These are trying days, and yet I pray that we continue to seek God's will and trust His love, grace and provision. We understand now even more than ever how important it is to provide a place for warm fellowship and love for these young people. May we be obedient and diligent as we serve His flock no matter how far away or how lost they may seem.
